Complete any one of the following activities and receive the St. George Patch. Complete any four additional activities from the requirements below and receive a cross for each activity to attach to the cross outlines on the patch.

- 2) Earn any "Footsteps of the American Saints" patch
- 3) Earn the "Scouting as Youth Ministry" patch

- 4) Earn a religious emblem in your rank of scouting –

- 5) Attend Mass in uniform on Scout Sunday, February 7, 2010.
- 6) Participate in the Ten Commandment Hike, April 24, 2010
- 7) Visit the Religious booth at the Camporall at Fort Niagara, May 14-16, 2010
- 8) Attend Mass in uniform at Our Lady of Victory Basilica in Lackawanna or  
attend Mass in uniform at Our Lady of Fatima in Lewiston.

**St. George is the patron saint of the Knights of the Round Table of Cavalry (which the word “chivalry” is derived) and the special saint of England.**

**He was born in Cappadocia in 303 A.D. and became known for his bravery as a cavalry soldier.**

**As the legend goes, St. George rode to Selem, Libya in time to save the king’s daughter from being sacrificed to a dragon. St. George stopped the dragon with his lance, then made a collar around the dragon’s neck and the princess was able to lead it like a lamb back to the city where the amazed city dwellers converted to Christianity.**

**When St. George faced a difficulty, he did not avoid it, but went at it with all the power in himself. That is exactly the way in which a Scout should face a challenge.**
